ATLANTIC FLYWAY BALD EAGLE BAND CONTACTS BY BAND COLOR

Welcome eagle enthusiasts! If you've spotted a Bald Eagle banded with a colored leg band, this is the website for you! Note these band colors only apply to eagles seen in the Eastern part of North America (east of the Appalachian Mountains).

You can check the table of color bands below to find the contact information for the corresponding eagle bander (some states have more than one bander so please contact both). This list is only for eagles banded east of the Appalachian Mountains and in Eastern Canada. These eagle banders rely on YOU, the bird-watching public, to spot and report sightings of banded eagles. These sightings are used in eagle research to track eagle movements, monitor survival rates, and causes of mortality.

In your email to the bander(s), provide your contact information, exact location of the eagle, band color, band code, and if possible, include a photo of the eagle. If a code was visible on the band, please report the code and color of the band to the USGS Bird Banding Lab at reportband.gov.

GOLD	MA	Andrew Vitz & Jennifer Longsdorf (MassWildlife)	Used from1987-2006 – The first character was always "W" followed by a letter and number, vertical, repeated 3x around band
GREEN	NJ	Kathy Clark (NJDEP)	2 characters, #s & letters, vertical, repeated 3x around band
GREEN/BLACK	FL	Brian Mealey, (Institute of Wildlife Sciences)	Green over Black, 2 characters, #s & letters, vertical, repeated 3x around band
ORANGE	QU	Jérôme Lemaître, (Québec MFFP)	
ORANGE	MA	Andrew Vitz & Jennifer Longsdorf (MassWildlife)	Used 2007-present. 2 characters, #s & letters, vertical, repeated 3x around band
PURPLE	VA	Bryan Watts (CCB)	2 characters, #s & letters, vertical, repeated 3x around band
PURPLE	MD	Bryan Watts (CCB)	2 characters, #s & letters, vertical, repeated 3x around band
RED	ME	Erynn Call (MDIFW); Chris DeSorbo (BRI)	Horizontal and vertical characters repeated 3x around band
RED/BLACK	NY	Katherine Yard (NYSDEC)	Red "A" over black 2 digit number
