them inside fertiliser sacks, tying the top and putting the bags inside a vehicle. It doesn't show what happened to them next but you can probably imagine; there have been enough previous cases where gamekeepers have been caught on camera bludgeoning trapped birds of prey to death (e.g. see here, here) to make an educated guess. These earlier convictions probably explain why these days its common to see the trapped birds being removed from the trap and taken away, presumably to be killed away from potential covert cameras. It's also telling that the gamekeepers involved in more recent cases typically wear face masks in an attempt to hide their identities. They've learned from the mistakes of others. As Mark discusses during the interview, it's not an offence to catch birds of prey in crow cage traps they often get in and can't then find a way out. If the trap operator releases them, unharmed, immediately after discovering them, then no offence has been committed. Putting them inside a sack and taking them away is a clear offence and is indicative of

further offences (i.e. killing the birds elsewhere).
