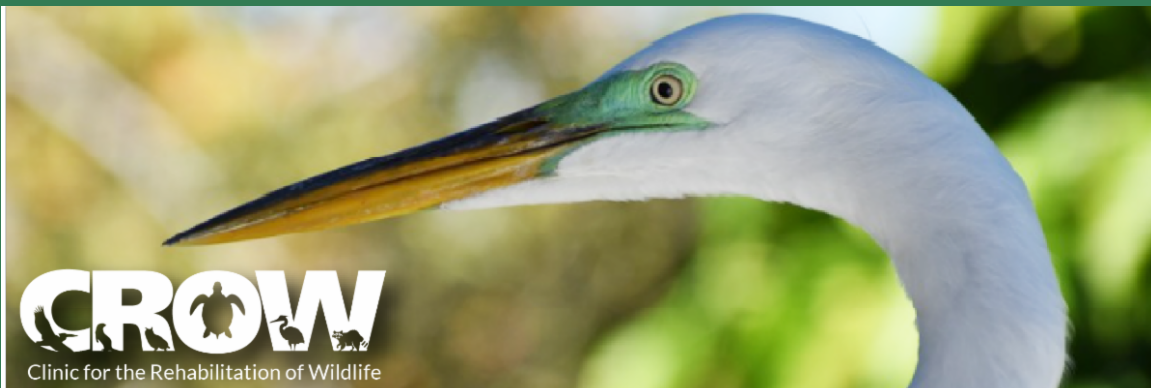

Patient of the Month: Mexican Free-Tailed Bat



We'd like to introduce you to one of our smallest, furriest patients--a Mexican Free-Tailed Bat! (patient #25-2907).

An adult female bat was found on the ground and was unable to fly. During



her intake examination, our team discovered that she was dehydrated, underweight, and experiencing intermittent body tremors, likely caused by stress and overall weakness.

We were able to coax her into eating, and she has been steadily regaining weight. Once she gains a bit more weight and strength, she will be ready to return to the wild where she belongs.

Mexican Free-Tailed Bats can fly up to speeds of just under 50 mph and reach altitudes of 10,800 feet. These nocturnal insect-eaters play a significant role in controlling mosquito populations. The largest colony of Mexican Free-Tailed Bats in Florida is at the University of Florida in Gainesville, with about 500,000 bats in residence.

Thank you for helping CROW give bats like her a second chance--every patient counts.
